- All persons entering courtroom must show a photo ID issued by a government agency, such as a driver's license or a bar identification card. **Columbus School of Law students should use their student IDs.**
- Backpacks, book bags, briefcases, laptop bags, suitcases, etc. will not be permitted in the courtroom. Students may leave their belongings in their lockers. Small purses will be permitted and will be inspected for security purposes.
- Visitors may only bring an electronic device (e.g., cell phone, laptop, MP3 player, etc.) into the courtroom if the device <u>does not</u> have a camera (still or video) or is <u>not capable</u> of recording audio. No storage facilities are available for checking electronic devices.
- The following individuals are allowed to bring electronic devices with camera and recording capabilities in the courtroom but must have the device turned totally off.
 - Members of the Bar Attorneys who display a bar identification card or other proof of membership of the bar of the Court of Appeals, District Court, or D.C. Bar.
 - Members of the Media Members of the media who are credentialed by either Court or who are credentialed by another federal or D.C. government entity, including the Supreme Court, Congress, a federal agency, or the D.C. government.
- Food and beverages are prohibited in the courtroom.
- All electronic devices must be turned off before entering the courtroom.
