

### **Director of ADR Programs - Nancy Stanley**

Nancy Stanley has been the Director of the ADR programs in the federal courts of the District of Columbia Circuit since 1989. Ms. Stanley previously held a number of different litigation positions in the federal government, working for the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the U.S. Department of Justice and the Federal Communications Commission. Earlier in her legal career she worked on Capitol Hill and was a partner in Blank Goodman Rone & Stanley, a New York City law firm. Ms. Stanley was educated at Knox College, in Galesburg, Illinois; at the University of Edinburgh, in Edinburgh, Scotland; and at the George Washington University Law School. She has taught mediation in a masters of law program at the G.W.U. Law School and is herself an accomplished mediator. As director of the D.C. Circuit's ADR programs, she oversees the Mediation Program in the U.S. District Court and serves as the Chief Mediator for the U.S. Court of Appeals.

### **Deputy ADR Program Counsel - Michael Terry**

Michael Terry was appointed to his current position in February of 1991. He previously served as the Dispute Resolution Specialist of the Domestic Relations Mediation Program at the D.C. Superior Court's Multi-Door Division. Mike has also served as a volunteer mediator at the Citizen's Compliant Center and the office of Human Rights. In his current position, he mediates on a regular basis and supervises a panel of approximately 200 volunteer lawyers who serve as mediators in the District Court. Mike graduated from Howard Law School in 1971 and is a member of the Bar in New York and the District of Columbia. He was in private practice for approximately four years. Mike has also held the positions of General Counsel for the University of the District of Columbia and Assistant General Counsel for the United Planning Organization.

### **ADR Administrative Assistant - Betty Steele**

Betty L. Steele joined the ADR programs as Administrative Assistant in 1995. Prior to that, she was secretary to the former Chief Judge Abner J. Mikva at the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit for 15 years and worked with him as a Congressional Aide in the U.S. House of Representatives from 1975-1979. Ms. Steele attended the Washington School for Secretaries in 1972. As Administrative Assistant, she assists in the administration of the dispute resolution programs in the U.S. Court of Appeals and the U.S. District Court for the D.C. Circuit.
