NOTICE OF PROPOSED CIRCUIT RULE CHANGE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR COMMENT

Notice is hereby given that the court, pursuant to D.C. Circuit Rule 47, proposes amending Circuit Rule 45 to limit closures of the Clerk's Office to federal holidays and any other day designated by the Chief Judge. This amendment is necessitated by recent changes to Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure 1 and 26, which would, in conjunction with Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 45, otherwise require the Clerk's Office to close on local legal holidays declared by the District of Columbia. Litigants will, nonetheless, be able to treat such local holidays as a legal holiday for purposes of calculating when a filing is due. See FRAP 26(a). Corresponding changes to the Circuit's Handbook of Practice and Internal Procedures will be made.
