STATEMENT OF WORK (SOW)

1.1 INTRODUCTION:

The U.S. Court of Appeals is seeking to make a “firm fixed price” award for the full demolition and replacement of the current ceiling located in Rm 5118, located on the Prettyman side of the E. Barrett Prettyman Courthouse. This project includes full demolition of existing ceiling and fixed seating currently located in the room. It will require gypsum bulkheads, lay-in acoustical ceiling tile, lighting, and a conditioned air distribution system be installed along with power and data lines supplied and prepped, all of which will be in conjunction with and coordinated alongside our Privacy Wall Contractor’s install.

2.1 OBJECTIVES:

The Contractor is expected to get Room 5118 to a “ready state” for the following applications: Paint, carpet, and new modular privacy wall systems, (which will be issued under a separate contract).

3 SCOPE:

3.1 – Contractor shall remove existing ceiling, fixed seating, finishes, and equipment in the room.

3.2 – Contractor shall remove 2'x2' fluorescent troffer housings from the existing ceiling and store for safe keeping for later use with new 2'x2' LED retrofit light fixtures in the new ceiling system. The court will provide the storage space for the above referenced materials.

3.3 – Contractor shall replace the existing ceiling system with a new ceiling system that includes LED 2'x2' retrofit and LED recessed down lights, ductwork and diffusers, acoustical ceiling tile grid system, and gypsum bulkheads to the extent indicated on the attached drawings.

3.4 – Contractor shall provide power and data lines with outlets as indicated on the drawings.

3.5 – Contractor shall repair, patch and prepare existing walls, ceiling and floor to the extent necessary to receive new work. Carpet and painting are under a separate contract.

3.6 – Contractor shall test and rebalance the existing mechanical air handling unit (AHU) that serves room 5118. The (AHU) is located in room 6108.

3.7 – Contractor shall coordinate the new ceiling system gypsum bulkheads with the privacy wall installation contractor, and court personnel.

3.8 – Contractor shall adjust the height of four sprinkler heads to coordinate with the finished height of the new ceiling system.


4 SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS/INFORMATION

4.1a – A preproposal meeting which includes a review of the existing space will be held on **August 28, 2019 at 10:30 a.m.** Interested contractors should meet at the main elevator lobby of the Prettyman Courthouse near the green marble kiosk.

4.1b – If the Contractor intends to use a **Subcontractor** for any of the services detailed in this project, the Contractor shall include the name of the “**sub**” and provide a description of how the “**sub**” will be managed during performance.

4.1c – It is strongly recommended that both the interested Contractor and the subcontractor attend the preproposal meeting referenced in 4.1a..

5 REQUIREMENTS

5.1 – Contractor shall review and adhere to project information as shown in the attachment named: "Replace U.S. Court of Appeals Ceiling at Room 5518 - 100% Final Design for Construction," dated 8/14/19. NOTE: Where brand names are indicated for deliverables, the contractor shall provide **brand name or Equal**. The contractor shall provide comparative spec sheets for any and all items for which they intend to use an equivalent to the deliverables specified in the attached drawings, no later than the proposal close date.

5.2a - Contractor shall organize and submit a schedule for work to be done according to the following parameters below within 15 days of award:. (5.2b,c).

5.2b - Work shall be done between the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. Monday through Friday and shall be coordinated with Contracting Officer's Representatives.

5.2c - Saturdays, Sundays, and federal holidays shall be approved in advance, and shall be coordinated in with Contracting Officer's Representatives.

5.3a - Contractor shall submit name, date of birth, and social security number of all workers that will be working on site for this work scope. Submittal of information shall be no later than 15 days after being notified of an award.

5.3b - A background check will be performed against the information provided. A purchase order will be issued upon notification that workers are suitable to work, unescorted, in the courthouse.

5.3c - Should it be determined that workers are not suitable a purchase order will not be issued. In this event, an explanation will not be provided; all decisions are final. Not applicable to workers who have already been cleared to work in the building in the preceding six months.

5.4 – Contractor shall take all necessary steps to protect the existing space and to limit the amount of dust and debris to surrounding areas. This typically includes the contractor's use of plastic protection surrounding workspace, along with entry and exit points. The contractor shall ensure that all debris is removed from the courthouse and will ensure that debris is not deposited within courthouse dumpsters.

5.5 – Contractor shall provide proposal no later than 5:00 PM, September 9, 2019

6.1 DELIVERABLES

All deliverables, (equipment and supplies) named in the project specifications and those deemed necessary by the Contractor, shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to supply and protect throughout the duration of the project. The Contractor shall coordinate the delivery of all materials and supplies with the Contracting Officer's Representatives. The courthouse has a standard loading dock and a freight elevator able to accommodate all materials specified in the Statement of Work. The court assumes no responsibility for damaged product, any corrections to defective or damaged product shall be accomplished at no additional cost to the judiciary, (except for those items indicated in Section 3.2 of the Statement of Work).

7.1 PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The overall period of performance for this contract will be 09/23/19 – March 31, 2020. Work shall be substantially complete no later than March 31, 2020.

8.1 REVIEW PERIOD & ACCEPTANCE

At the completion of the project, the Contractor shall contact the Contracting Officer to schedule a walk-through of the completed space. The Contracting Officer, the Contractor and the Contracting Officer's Representatives will walk the space to identify any punch list items still outstanding or certify that the area is deemed to be in a "Ready State" for other contractual applications discussed in Section 2.1., of this solicitation. If accepted, the Contracting Officer will issue a close out notification to the Contractor. If the project, (*or some aspect of*) is rejected, the contractor will have 10 working days to correct the deficiency. Payment will be withheld until the project has been deemed accepted.

9.1 PAYMENT

The Contractor shall submit an invoice for full payment in accordance with Clause 7-125, Invoices, after receiving acceptance notification in writing from Contracting Officer. (Clauses attached).
